Dear Parents

In what continues to be a challenging operating environment, the Board is very much aware of the pressure that many in our community are facing and remains vigilant in its responsibility to manage our increased costs. In reviewing the budget and setting tuition fees, the Board must balance the goals and objectives of the school with our desire to maintain relative affordability for the educational opportunities that Ballarat Clarendon College provides for its students and families.

Over the course of 2020-2021, the Board has invested in professional learning for all staff. Improving the quality of the teaching of our robust and sequenced knowledge-rich curriculum is the most significant driver in improving student outcomes. Furthermore, the Board's commitment to Clarendon's Student Development curriculum is evident in the investment in the construction of the residential campus at Yuulong. On nearly 50 hectares with views across the Southern Ocean, the campus will welcome its first group of students in early 2022.

The Board must also address the serious impact of the federal government's proposed changes to school funding. The move to a Direct Measure of Income score based on the *median* income of parents within the Clarendon community will have a major impact on the school's capacity to deliver the high-quality programs and infrastructure that we have worked so hard to achieve.

The Board's intention is to ensure that the school's projected loss of funding under the DMI does not negatively impact our desire to provide high quality educational opportunities for as many students as possible. Incremental fee increases over a longer period will aim to keep Clarendon affordable for regional and rural families while also maintaining the Board's commitment to exceptional student outcomes, robust staff professional learning and quality infrastructure and growth.


With these factors in mind, the Board has determined that, while 3YO early learning will remain the same, the annual fee increases for 2022 range between \$100 and \$320.

The tuition fees and boarding fees for 2022 have now been ratified by the Board and I provide formal notification of the 2022 fee schedule in the attached pages.

Consistent with previous years, I have included a diagram providing an overview of the basic components of our 2022 budget income and recurrent expenditure, as well as a comparison of our 2022 fees with the 2021 fees of other independent schools. In reviewing this data, the Board believes our fee structure compares favourably with other independent schools.

Email advice on the process for re-enrolment for the 2022 academic year will be forwarded shortly. Re-enrolment must be completed by Friday 5 November 2021.

The Clarendon Board prides itself on governing in an effective and efficient way; however, without the support of parents and the commitment of all staff, we would not be the celebrated school that we are today.

Annual tuition fees for domestic students eligible for government funding (including Australian citizens, permanent residents and some temporary visa holders) will be billed in four instalments up to and including Year 11 and in three instalments for Year 12.

A student normally will not be permitted to commence a term unless accounts have been paid by the due date or a formal arrangement made with the Business Manager – Finance prior to the due date.

The tuition fee covers most curriculum expenses, including year-level camps and class excursions. Fees and charges levied by Clarendon directly related to the provision of an approved course of education are exempt from GST.

Other costs that may be incurred include individual music tuition, student-caused damage to property or false fire alarms, travel and phone calls. Fees for incidentals will be billed in arrears and are due and payable 30 days from billing.

Fees will be levied for overseas trips and special functions. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) will be advised in advance of these fees which will be payable on the acceptance of a student's participation in the activity. Please note that students will be unable to participate unless school fee accounts are up-to-date or an agreed payment arrangement has been accepted by the Principal or Business Manager – Finance and is adhered to.

3-YEAR-OLD FUNDED KINDERGARTEN

The state government is rolling out funding for a child participating in the 3-year-old kindergarten program for ONE year only. If your child has previously had a funded kindergarten place, you may not be eligible for further funding and an additional charge may apply. Please contact Clarendon for further information.

4-YEAR-OLD FUNDED KINDERGARTEN

The state government provides funding for a child participating in the 4-year-old kindergarten program for ONE year only. If your child has previously had a funded kindergarten place, you may not be eligible for further funding and an additional charge may apply. Please contact Clarendon for further information.

Annual boarding fees for domestic students eligible for government funding (including Australian citizens, permanent residents and some temporary visa holders) will be billed in four instalments up to and including Year 11 and in three instalments for Year 12.

GST payable on the food component of boarding fees is included in the schedule above.

Additional charges may apply to boarders. These may include travel, social activities and expenses incurred by Clarendon acting in loco parentis.

YUULONG REMOTE CAMPUS FEE

The 2022 fee for attendance at Yuulong Remote Campus during Year 9 is \$5,960. This is a subsidised fee which covers part of the cost of transport, food and accommodation. This is an annual fee which is billed in four equal instalments of \$1,490. All students attending Yuulong are required to pay this fee. It is not covered by any scholarship or bursary awarded by Ballarat Clarendon College. Boarders attending Yuulong will not be charged a boarding fee for the period they are at the Yuulong campus.

NOTEBOOK COMPUTERS

Students in Years 5 to 9 are required to purchase a tablet computer through the Ballarat Clarendon College program. Students in Years 10 to 12 requiring a notebook or tablet computer may purchase one through Clarendon's program. The notebook or tablet fee may change from year-to-year according to the models, supplier and brand available at the time of purchase/lease. PERFORMING ARTS

Music tuition fees and other incidental charges for individual, paired or group Performing Arts lessons are levied in advance of the term and are detailed below.

Instruments can be hired through the school. Please note that, if an instrument is lost or damaged, the cost to replace or repair will be billed to your fee account.

Accompaniment fees for rehearsals and exams are additional if applicable.

VOLUNTARY BUILDING FUND/SCHOLARSHIP FUND/LIBRARY DONATIONS

Families may wish to make a voluntary donation to our Building Fund, Scholarship Fund or Library. Donations over \$2 are tax deductible.

Voluntary Building Fund donations contribute to the purchase and/or construction of buildings which otherwise would be delayed or unattainable due to a lack of finance. These buildings contribute to the current and future infrastructure enabling us to focus on continuing to provide exceptional learning experiences for our students.

Voluntary Scholarship Fund donations provide financial support to students who may not otherwise have the opportunity to attend Ballarat Clarendon College. Scholarships are offered for Academic, Performing Arts, Visual Arts and Excellence. Information regarding the Scholarship program is available on connect@clarendon.

A voluntary tax deductible Scholarship or Building Fund donation of \$50 per instalment is shown on each family's statement. This amount has not been added to the total amount payable on the statement. To make a voluntary Scholarship or Building Fund donation, families are asked to tick their selection and add the amount to the total amount before returning the remittance advice with their payment.

Voluntary donations made to the Library provide support for resources and are tax deductible.

REGISTRATION FEE

A registration fee of \$100 is payable upon submission of the Application for Registration form. This fee does not guarantee a place offer at Clarendon and is not refundable or transferable.

CONFIRMATION DEPOSIT

A confirmation deposit for each child is payable of \$3,000 (reviewed annually by Clarendon) upon acceptance of Clarendon's Letter of Offer. The confirmation deposit is **not refundable** if the child does not attend in the Year of Offer or does not subsequently attend Clarendon (Prep to Year 12) and is **not transferable** to other students or Clarendon charges. When enrolment proceeds in the Year of Offer, the confirmation deposit will be allocated as set out below. \$200 is retained by Clarendon for administrative costs associated with enrolments and alumni.

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, written application may be made to the Principal to amend the Year of Offer. The Principal may agree to such an amendment and apply the confirmation deposit to the second term of the revised Year of Offer at their absolute discretion.

WITHDRAWAL OF STUDENTS – FEE IN LIEU OF NOTICE

A term's notice in writing must be received by the Principal before a student leaves or a boarder becomes a day student. Should written notice not be provided within the specified timeframe, a charge of up to **half an instalment's fee** will be levied. Notice of withdrawal should include the reason for withdrawal.

CONCESSIONS

Scholarships and Bursaries

Scholarship and bursary programs are available at Ballarat Clarendon College for students eligible for government funding. Further information is available at www.clarendon.vic.edu.au or by contacting the Finance Department.

It is a condition for continued tenure of any scholarship or bursary that the account is maintained within the conditions of enrolment. Accounts falling into arrears are liable to withdrawal of scholarship and bursary concessions previously awarded.

In the event that a student should be awarded a scholarship, bursary or other discount to a value greater than 20% of a fee, that student becomes ineligible for a sibling discount upon that fee and the number of siblings in the family, who are eligible for a sibling discount, will be reduced accordingly.

An administration fee may be levied for each additional Statement issued arising from Late Payment of accounts or for failure (for any reason) of a financial institution to honour a cheque or electronic transaction.
